Monday, May 26 - John H. Stevens Day

Our big opening event, featuring vintage games and toys, music, refreshments, and more! Explore our display of photos and artifacts from early Minneapolis. A great introduction to the history of our fine City! (12:00-4:00PM, Free)

Sunday, June 22 - Duke Addicks, Dakota storyteller

Tells the story of Grey Cloud, Woman of Power (1765 to 1844) as told by her husband, Scottish-born fur trader James Aird. (2:00PM, Free)

Sunday, July 20 - Duke Addicks tells of Neco hundah, the Eagle Catcher

Born in 1765 in his father's planting village located almost exactly on the Stevens House original site. Facing challenges and dangers, and not accepted by the other boys, he went on to gain their respect and become the most powerful Dakota Chief in the Upper Mississippi Region. (2:00PM, Free)

Sunday, August 17 - The Love Flute

Mr. Addicks portrays Fur trader James Aird as he plays Native American flute music and tells stories of the important role of music in the lives of the Indians. Hear him play some 250-year old tunes on the Native American flute, which was invented right around here. (2:00PM, Free)

Monday, September 1 - Founders' Fest

Our grand closing event is a big "thank you" to the community for supporting us again this year. Live music by Amador Hill, vintage games and toys, storytelling, refreshments, historic gift items, and more.
