

Budget Alignment

- Columbia Mill excavation and rehabilitation
- Tight construction market
- Limited construction season and high labor costs
- Steel tariffs and trade uncertainties









Water Works Program

- Indoor public support areas: restrooms, seating, flexible room, etc
- Park Board staff area to support visitors and programming
- Area for a food vendor with year round operations
- Outdoor circulation improvements
- Outdoor seating and gathering places
- Outdoor play and performance areas
- Enhanced visitor experience through landscape, art, signage, site furnishings
- Goal: Maintain program and on-budget




