
STEWART PARK APPROVED MASTER PLAN

The Stewart Park Master Plan image below is from the South Area Master Plan. The master plan was approved in 2016, and is the result of two years of intensive community engagement.

Our project funding is earmarked for implementing site improvements indicated in, or consistent with, the approved Master Plan. We are have been engaging the community to identify priorities for improvements that fit into our project budget.

We've been asking about the items noted below as "New" and have also heard requests for a few items that are consistent with the master-plan. We don't have enough funding to implement everything currently shown below.



Recreation Center improvements are not part of the master plan. Recreation **Centers** are addressed in Closing the Gap, Investing in Youth, and will be addressed by other funding sources.

MPRB would like to delay work and improvements for the basketball court which will no longer be on parkland after the land exchange takes place, due to a pending land exchange between the school and MPRB.






